1. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add the penne pasta, and cook until tender, 8 to 10 minutes.
2. Meanwhile, heat 1 tablespoon of olive oil in a skillet over medium heat. Place bacon in the skillet, and cook until browned and crisp. Add garlic, and cook for about 1 minute. Stir in the tomatoes, and cook until heated through.
3. Place the spinach into a colander, and drain the hot pasta over it so it is wilted. Transfer to a large serving bowl, and toss with the remaining olive oil, and the bacon and tomato mixture.

## PLAN AHEAD TO STAY SAFE



Know what's below.  
Call before you dig.

Natural gas is a safe energy source and natural gas leaks are very rare. However, there are a few things to keep in mind should a leak occur. Atlanta Gas Light has added the odor of rotten eggs to the gas to give it a distinctive smell. If you ever suspect that you smell natural gas, go to a phone away from the smell and call 877-427-4321.

### More important tips:

- If you smell gas indoors, leave the building immediately and have others also exit immediately.
- Do not light a match, operate natural gas appliances, use a phone, or turn an electrical switch on or off.
- Keep everyone away from the area of the odor.
- Do not start a car.

### NEVER TRY TO FIND A LEAK YOURSELF.

Also, please be aware that excavation work is the most common cause of natural gas emergencies. Before digging, state law requires you to have your utility lines professionally marked. Call the toll-free number, 8-1-1, at least three full business days before digging, excluding weekends and holidays, to have your underground utilities located and marked free of charge.
